I'm writing on behalf of the Parjana drainage system, which was installed at our Brandon Phillips Field prior to the 2014 baseball season in Cincinnati. I'm also endorsing the services provided by Andrew Mauk, who has worked tirelessly to communicate the system and remain in contact with our team well beyond the completion of the work.

This high school field was renovated in 2009 and has been a challenge to maintain ever since, due to some unique geography and drainage issues. It is a vitally important field, as it is one of a handful of urban baseball diamonds with a grass infield and high level amenities, not to mention the fact that it bears the name and investment of one of our All Star players.

While the product was foreign to many of our traditional field partners initially, the outcome has been extremely positive. We experienced one of our better seasons on the field since it was rebuilt and it's hard to imagine that this would have been possible without the Parjana system. Challenges with standing water and muddy outfield conditions that forced cancellations in the past were much less prevalent this past year.

While it might be difficult to quantify a new product's success, I can certainly testify to the level of service as well as the professionalism and hustle throughout the process. Our biggest fear was potential damage to the field during installation and as promised, it was not an issue whatsoever. We're looking forward to a spring that doesn't require any additional maintenance this year.

This has been a positive experience for us at Brandon Phillips Field, thanks to Andrew's efforts. We are open to the idea of considering the Parjana product in the future at additional ball fields experiencing similar drainage and water challenges.
